Spotlight on ... Jean Gay



As part of our 50th year celebration, the History Committee is highlighting some of our "most senior" members—those 90 and above.

Jean Gay was born November 17, 1934 in Johnstown, Pennsylvania to Corinne Holcomb and Harry Thomas Buchanan. Jean had a brother and a sister, both deceased. Jean's father was employed with various power companies and they lived in different states. When they lived in Wilmington, North Carolina, Jean attended East Carolina College, now East Carolina University, and majored in Home Economics. She met her future husband, Paul, there and they were married in Raleigh during her Senior year in school. At that time, her parents lived in Raleigh where her father worked for CP & L. Paul was two years older than Jean and was working in Lancaster, South Carolina. After her graduation, Jean became a vocational teacher.

While in Raleigh, Paul was recruited to Sanford Central High School as a football coach, athletic director, and teacher. Later he was involved in the PE Department. Jean was a vocational teacher at the high school.

Jean and Paul have three sons, P.J., Doug, and Joe. When they moved to Sanford, Jean transferred her Methodist membership to Steele Street and Paul joined Steele Street in 1960 with Dr. Potter as the minister.

Over the years, Jean has enjoyed working with the children in Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. She worked with Betty Hickman and Madge Oldham. She has served on Altar Guild, filling bags for the hungry, and served on the Saint Luke Preschool Board. She was a volunteer receptionist in the Williams Lobby with Anne Hurley and others.

When asked about her favorite hymn, she said she loved all the old hymns. As a child, her mother would play the piano and she would sing to these wonderful hymns.

We are so glad that the Gay family moved to Sanford and enriched us in many ways.

Spotlight on ... Janet Edrington

As part of our 50th year celebration, the History Committee is highlighting some of our "most senior" members—those 90 and above.

Janet Edrington was born November 25, 1933 in Portsmouth, Virginia, where she grew up and was educated. Janet went to Mary Washington in Fredericksburg, Virginia and graduated in 1954 with a teaching degree. After graduation she went home to Portsmouth and began teaching English. She become involved in the McGuffey Clinic reading program, sponsored by the University of Virginia, which teaches older children to read and she implemented it at her high school.

Janet met her husband, Charles, in 1952. He was at the University of Arkansas and the Korean War was going on. Charles left school to join the Navy, where he served for four years. In 1956 he returned and they were married that June. They lived in Portsmouth while Charles finished school at William and Mary in Williamsburg. In 1959 he attended dental school at the University of Tennessee.

The Edringtons moved to Selma, NC before moving to Sanford to provide dental care for the community. On June 16, 1964 Edrington Dental Care was opened in Jonesboro, across from Jonesboro Methodist Church where they attended. Rev. Vernon Tyson was their minister. They watched as the old Jonesboro Methodist Church was torn down and the new one was built. During that time, Janet did office work while leading a remedial reading program for Ken Brinson.

The couple had two children, David and Susan, and two granddaughters. When their children were small they made the decision to move to Saint Luke in 1974. Charles joined the men's class and Janet joined the Wesley Class, which was called the Discussion Class at that time. They had been married for 58 years when Charles passed away in 2014.

Janet is still a member of the Wesley Class, Thursday Morning Bible Study, Circle #2, and Keenagers. She has served on the Hostess Committee, the Bread Basket Team, and has enjoyed numerous Bible studies. One main joy Janet enjoyed for six years was playing the piano for the 9:00 am traditional service, which was held in the sanctuary when Rev. Reggie Ponder was the pastor. Janet treasures the many friends she has made and the lifetime relationships she still enjoys at Saint Luke.

December 15: Baby wipes and diapers (sizes 4-6)



- 1) Write checks to Saint Luke with "WNCC Disaster" on the memo line. We will forward the funds without delay.
- 2) Write a check to WNCC Treasurer, memo line "Disaster Response" and mail it to Western NCC, PO Box 2757, Huntersville, NC 28070-2757.
- 3) You may also donate to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) by writing checks to Saint Luke with "UMCOR Domestic" on the memo line. These funds will be distributed to areas within the United States that experience natural disasters (including, but not limited to, Western North Carolina).

Get Trained to Be Part of a Work Crew

Many of you have received Early Response Training, but are not currently certified. If you wish to recertify or certify for the first time, there is a training session on **December 7 at Wendell UMC**. For first-time trainees, the time is 8:00 am – 4:00 pm. If you need to recertify, times are 8:00 am—12:00 pm. To register, go to: https://nccumc.org/disaster/training. *Each team must have one certified person for every volunteer who is not certified. This is a change from previous requirements*. Early Response teams go in for "clean-up and tear-out" after first responders complete their work and on invitation of the resident Bishop. Recovery/ rebuilding teams will go in later. Western North Carolina will be in recovery for a very long time. If you have time and skills, the people will need you.)
