## The Need Is Great ... and On-Going



We all have been deeply affected by the plight of those who were in the direct path of Hurricane Helene. Rescue and recovery efforts are ongoing in the North Carolina mountains. We continue to pray for those who are missing and all those who have lost family members, friends, homes, and livelihoods.

#### How can we help?

**Donate financially.** If you want to ensure that your donation goes directly to Western North Carolina, there are two options:

- 1) Write checks to Saint Luke with "WNCC Disaster" on the memo line. We will forward the funds without delay.
- 2) Write a check to WNCC Treasurer, memo line "Disaster Response" and mail it to Western NCC, PO Box 2757, Huntersville, NC 28070-2757.
- 3) You may also donate to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) by writing checks to Saint Luke with "UMCOR Domestic" on the memo line. These funds will be distributed to areas within the United States that experience natural disasters (including, but not limited to, Western North Carolina).

#### Get Trained to Be Part of a Work Crew

Many of you have received Early Response Training, but are not currently certified. If you wish to recertify or certify for the first time, there is a training session on **November 16 at Apex UMC.** For first-time trainees, the time is 8:30 am – 4:30 pm. If you need to recertify, times are 8:30 am—12:30 pm. To register, go to: https://nccumc.org/disaster/training. *Each team must have one certified person for every volunteer who is not certified. This is a change from previous requirements.* Early Response teams go in for "clean-up and tear-out" after first responders complete their work and on invitation of the resident Bishop. Recovery/ rebuilding teams will go in later. Western North Carolina will be in recovery for a very long time. If you have time and skills, the people will need you.)

## Flood Buckets and Hygiene Kits Needed!

#### These may be brought to Saint Luke.

If you belong to a group that would like to make UMCOR kits, please key in NCCUMC.org/disaster. You should see a drop-down menu that includes the various kits that may be assembled, the items needed, and how to put them together.



- One five-gallon round bucket with re-sealable lid (14.35" h  $\,\mathrm{x}$  12.19" w  $\,\mathrm{x}$  12.19" d) (No screw lids; bucket may be used, but must be free from all residual product; advertisements on the outside acceptable
- One 32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner (no spray cleaners)
- One 16-34 oz. bottle dish soap
- One 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener (liquid, not gel)
- One 6 –14 oz. pump spray insect repellant (pack of 10-20 wipes also acceptable)
- One scrub brush with our without handle
- **18 re-usable cleaning wipes** (no terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels; remove from packaging
- **Five scouring pads** (no stainless steel pads with soap in them; remove from packaging

- 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 foot clothesline (cotton or plastic line)
- 24-roll of heavy duty trash bags (33-45 gallon size); remove from packaging
- Five N-95 respirator dust masks (1-3mm thickness); no surgical masks
- Two pairs kitchen gloves; durable for multiple uses; remove from packaging
- One pair work gloves (cotton with leather palm or all leather)

## **Hygiene Kits**

- One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches); No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One washcloth; No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One comb; Must be sturdy with at least 4-7 inches of teeth; No pocket combs or picks; Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 4-7 inches of teeth.
- One toenail or fingernail clipper; No emery boards or metal nail files
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger); No Ivory or Jergen's soap; Do not remove from packaging.
- One adult toothbrush; Do not remove from packaging; Personal advertising not acceptable
- 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches); Common household bandages acceptable
- One one-gallon size re-sealable bag
- \*Do not add toothpaste when assembling kits
